### 1- Nucleo fondante: Unit 1 - Happy families

Argomenti svolti in relazione al nucleo sopraccitato

Entry test correction. Pronunciation: the sound schwa + minimal pairs (bed/bad; sheep/ship). Introduce yourself: speaking activity. Likes and dislikes. Love, (really) like, enjoy, do not mind, can't stand, hate + ING form. Feel like + ING. Vocabulary: personality adjectives; prefixes to form opposites. Describing personality and physical appearance: What are you like/what do you look like? Unit 1. Speaking: Is 'sharenting' a good or a bad thing? Justify your opinion. Vocabulary: ages and stages of life; the family; words connected with the family. Speaking activity. Idiomatic uses of TO BE (... years old, hungry/thirsty, cold/hot/warm, in a hurry/in a rush, ashamed, afraid/scared of/, sleepy, right/wrong). Present simple: affirmative, negative and interrogative form. Short answers. How long does it take (you/her..) to + verb? How often..? Adverbs of frequency and position in the sentence + vocabulary extension (once in a while/every now and then, every now and again, every so often, once in a blue moon). Noun suffixes -ment, -ion, -ence page 9 ex. 2-3. Vocabulary: argue/bicker/fall out/quarrel/have an argument. Grammar: whose is/are..? How much is/are...? How much do/does...cost? The adverb EVER. Great learners great thinkers: video + listening activity. Ageism in the UK. Speaking activity in pairs: negative attitudes towards teenagers, prejudices, stereotypes. Homework correction. Asking about frequency. Present continuous. Spelling rules with -ING and -S third person singular present simple. Uses of present continuous. State verbs. The verb HAVE (idiomatic uses). Listening page 14. Speaking: asking for personal information + talking about similarities and differences. Uncountable nouns and how to count them (advice, evidence, homework, luggage, furniture, etc). How much/how many. Video Let them talk. Vocabulary: idioms (a piece of cake, to cut a long story short, bore sb to tears, sleep like a log, hit the hay, safe and sound, be on the same page, etc.). Speaking: arguments between parents and teenagers (learn: tell sb off/reproach; get bad/good marks; do well at school). Listening activities page 12. Subject and object questions. Prepositions in questions. Vocabulary extension: colour idioms (see red, be green with envy, out of the blue, white lie, etc).

#### 2- Nucleo fondante: Unit 2 - Law and order

Argomenti svolti in relazione al nucleo sopraccitato

Vocabulary: colour idioms (part 2) + quiz. Unit 2: Law and Order. Vocabulary in context: crimes; detective work. Vocabulary extension: verbs for crimes (rob, hack, mug, vandalise, witness, etc). How to pronounce -ed in regular verbs in the past simple. Speaking activity: summarising three stories + think critically. Phrasal verbs connected with investigating and finding: look into, come across, work out, look for, find out, work out, turn up, come up with. Social and emotional learning: being considerate / right and wrong actions. Video page 22 (comprehension check + put the events in order) + speaking activity. What is empathy? Speaking activity (decide what to do in these situations and why). Past simple of the verb to be, of regular and irregular verbs (affirmative, negative, interrogative form). Time expressions used with the past simple. Adjective-noun (proud-pride, angry-anger, afraid-fear, etc.) Phrasal verbs: look back, look ahead, look after, look out for, look forward to, look round. Practising asking questions about a gapped text on detective stories (page 21 ex. 6), pair work. Communication: apologising. Expressions commonly used to say you are sorry and to accept/reject an apology. Listening activities pages 24+26. Speaking activity in pairs. Past continuous: affirmative, negative, interrogative forms. Online exercises: past simple vs past continuous. Cloze, gapped text B1 and B2. Speaking: find the differences between the picture and the listening. Asking and answering questions about a picture. Writing activity: invent a new identity and write an informal email following the instructions.

Video + comprehension check. Speaking activities, body language. Listening page 38 on artificial languages. Defining relative clauses: who, that, which, where, whose, when; ex. 1a, 1b, 3 page 38. Omission of the relative pronoun. Prepositions in relative clauses. The use of which in non-defining relative clauses.
